ACKNOWLEDGEMENT PAGE

In entering into the discernment process for the sixth Bishop Suffragan for Federal Ministries, I acknowledge that I am aware of the following requirements and features of the process.

- The House of Bishops elects this bishop suffragan, according to canon. The House of Bishops will meet the final candidates put forward by the Nominating Committee, and the Petition Candidates, during its regular meeting at Camp Allen, Texas, March 19 to 24, 2010. The candidates must be in attendance. It will be during that gathering of the House of Bishops that they will vote.
- After the election, the bishop suffragan elect must gain the consent of the majority of the Standing Committees, as provided by canon.
- A select committee of the House of Bishops, chaired by Bp. Nathan Baxter of Central Pennsylvania, is overseeing the discernment process. That committee asked an appointed Selection Committee of lay and clergy involved with Federal Ministries to put together a profile of the bishop suffragan's ministry for use in the discernment process, and to suggest members the select committee might appoint to a Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee receives names and information on candidates, and presents a small, diverse slate of names to the select committee and the House of Bishops. The select committee will also receive names

through a petition process once the slate is publicly announced from the Nominating Committee, in February of 2010.

- All final candidates, both through the nominating and the petition process, must formally respond the Episcopal Church's Behavioral Screening Questions, and undergo a background check, with acceptable results as determined by the select committee and the Presiding Bishop, from both.
- The consecration is scheduled for June 19, 2010, at the National Cathedral in Washington DC.
- The Bishop Suffragan for Federal Ministries is based in the Washington DC area.
